Through Maps and Places local communities and stakeholders can actively improve their dialogue to enhance the cultural heritage of their cities while engaging in participatory mapping activities.

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Summary

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1/ How to explore Maps

The ParticiMap tool facilitates geographic surveys to collect Places using a Map as the main interface. To explore the Maps created by the community in the platform follow these steps:

1. Navigate to the Maps section at <https://participimap.cartospot.com/maps/>.
2. In this section, you will find all available Maps.
3. Use the sidebar functionality –**Filter by Pilot Community**– to select Maps from "Elfsina," "Balina," or "Milano."
4. Each Map is displayed as a card with information and a button to view the selected Map

2/ Mapping a new Place: How can I contribute to a Map?

To contribute a new Place to a Map, follow these steps:

1. Navigate to the desired Map.
2. Click the **ADD A PLACE** button.
3. This action will show:
 - A red marker with a '+' sign on the basemap indicating where your new Place will be geolocated.

- The Map's geosurvey, which contains a set of questions for you to submit data and an image or photo using your mobile phone's camera. This information will be associated with the Place on the Map.

Anyone can contribute to a Map. Participants can submit data as anonymous users where entering a name and email is optional, but also it is possible to [sign up](#) to contribute with a personal account.

When setting the Place geographic position:

- Zoom in and drag the basemap to set the correct position for the Place.
- The geosurvey will also display an approximate geocoded Address that is automatically generated.
- This address is submitted as a complementary reference to the precise geographic coordinates of the Place.



3/ How to create a Map and design a Geosurvey for data collection?

3.1 Creating a New Map

Only authenticated users can create Maps. Therefore, you need to create an account and log in first. Follow these steps to create a new Map:

1. **Navigate to the Maps section:** Go to the [Maps section](#).
2. **Create an account and log In:** If you don't have an account, click on the **Login In** button and complete the registration form in [Create an account here!](#) If you already have an account, just enter your credentials.
3. **Click on –Create Your Map–:**
 - In the Maps section, you will find a **Create Your Map** button. Click on this button to start the Map creation process.
 - Alternatively, you can find the **Create a Map** button in the navbar menu under your avatar image.



4. **Follow the Steps:** The Map creation process is guided through a series of steps. Follow these steps to complete the setup of your new Map.

Note: Currently, only the "Standard" map creation process is available.

3.2 Following the Map Creation Process

1. Name Your Map:

- Provide a name for your Map.
- Select the name of your community from the dropdown.
- Set the start and end dates and hours during which your Map will be open to receive contributions from the community.
- Click the **Save and Continue** button to proceed.

2. Update the "About this Map" Section:


- Add a title and a short description of your Map.
- Use the online rich-text editor to style the content as desired.
- Click the **Save** button to continue.



3. Center Your Map:

- Drag the map to position the crosshair at the desired location.
- Click the **Save Map Center** button to continue.

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4. Add Place Categories:

- Enter the name of each Place category (e.g., Public markers) and select an icon from the dropdown.
- Click **Save and Add Another** for each category you want to include.
- When adding the last category, click **Save and Finish** to continue.

5. Design Your Geosurvey:

- Add questions or data inputs for your Geosurvey. These questions will be associated with each Place and displayed in a form for data collection.
- The ParticiMap tool includes a default question to collect the name of each Place. You will see this default setting initially.
- Click **Continue** to start designing your own questions or data inputs.

Creating Questions and Data Inputs:

- First, write the text for your question or data input.
- Optionally, add a placeholder for the question.
- Select the type of question or data input from the following options:
 - **Text**
 - **Text area**
 - **Dropdown (single select)**
 - **Option buttons (single select)**
 - **Check group (multiple selections)**
- Check the checkbox if you want a question to be optional to answer.
